OUTREACH

International Christian Voice Early in December, we welcomed parishioner Javaid Bakhsh who preached, on behalf of our ministry partner, International Christian Voice ("ICV"), on the plight of persecuted Christians. A special offering opportunity was provided and Christ Church parishioners responded generously. We were able to provide a cheque in the amount of \$2,600 towards their sponsorship of two refugee families currently being held in detention in Thailand. <u>Caring & Sharing</u> For many parishioners, our Caring & Sharing program represents the spirit of Christmas. Each year, under the leadership of our Outreach Coordinator, Jean Jamieson, families are provided with everything they need for Christmas and more! This year, over \$7,400 was receipted through Christ Church and another estimated \$6,000 that filled presents and stockings for the 11 families that we sponsored this year. ICV is currently in the midst of sponsoring two families. Huma is a single, Pakistani Christian persecuted for her faith and Yuthasiny & Navarathinam are a Sri Lankan couple forced to flee from their country because of their Tamil ethnicity. Under the Immigration, Refugee and Citizenship Canada ("IRCC") guidelines, \$42,000 is needed to sponsor these families that are currently being held under inhumane conditions in the Immigration Detention Centre in Bangkok, Thailand.

Last year, many of us from Christ Church attended this Fundraiser Gala and it our privilege to do so again this year.

Tickets are \$100 for 3-Course sit-down meal. Tax receipts will be issued through Christ Church, Brampton.

F2020 FINANCIAL RESULTS – QUARTER 2 (December 31, 2020)

On the next page, we have published our financial position as at December 31, 2019. It represents our half-way point of our fiscal year that runs from July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020. We always keep a close eye on our financial position and believe it is important we share it with you on a regular basis. While we really don't start financial planning for our next fiscal year until after Easter, it is this time of year that we do start giving it consideration.

Key Points:

- Over all we have had a solid half of the year with offerings up 12% from last year and expenses running as planned.
- We were both delighted and grateful to receive two unplanned gifts in the 2nd quarter totalling \$20,000. These extraordinary gifts were, as per the donors' wishes, applied equally to General Offerings and Future Ministries.
- Our regular offerings, budgeted with a modest yearly increase of 3%, is slightly behind at 2%. With a number of
 families having relocated and an unusual number of funerals in the fall, we are concerned that our regular offerings
 may finish behind budget.
- We are expecting our insurance costs to normalize in the latter half of the year as a result in the delay of the renewal placement fee being received in January.
- We would also expect to see Program Education costs to normalize over the balance of the year as it is this time of year that historically we see an increase. (e.g. Lent, Cool Church, Day Camp, etc.)
- We are pleasantly surprised by the reduction in utility costs and are hopeful that this is a result of our investment in replacing incandescent and fluorescent lights with LED lighting early in 2019 and the addition of insulation in the ceiling of the auditorium when the roof was replaced in the summer of 2018.
- The special project expense is the costs associated with the refurbishment of the outdoor signs and the replacement of the hymns books. Both of these costs were underwritten by members of the congregation for which we are thankful.
- Professional fees are in relation to our annual audit that we amortize over the year.

At all times, we attempt to be respectful and kind with our posts and keep the safety of our children, young people and vulnerable adults top of mind.

<u>Special Vestry</u> – Yearly the Diocese of Toronto calls upon the parishes to present a Social Justice motion. This year's motion is entitled "Taking Action on Climate Change". We will be having a Special Vestry on Sunday, February 16 @ 10:15 to present the following motion:

We, the vestry of Christ Church (Brampton) in the Diocese of Toronto, recognize that there is a global climate emergency. We acknowledge that all sectors of society, including government, business, churches and other non-profit organizations, and private individuals, have an obligation to do what they can to minimize their contribution to climate change.

We call on the government of Canada to commit to the following:

- End public financing of the fossil fuel industry (oil, gas, coal)
- Bring Canada's climate and energy policy into alignment with the Paris Accord emissions targets to do our part to limit the rise in global average temperatures below 1.5 degrees Celsius.
- Support a just transition to a low-carbon economy through investment in renewable energy sources and infrastructure, energyefficient technologies, and skills development and retraining for highquality, sustainable jobs in the renewable energy sector.
- Assist Indigenous, northern, and coastal communities, and other vulnerable populations, to adapt to and mitigate the impacts of climate change on their local environments.

2020 Envelopes – You may recall from our November letter, that we reduced our envelope sets from 180 to 150. Parishioners that previously held envelopes numbered 151 to 180 were reassigned effective January 2020. Carolynne Atkinson worked diligently to make this happen and we remain grateful for her work in this area.

<u>Stewardship</u> – As you review your enclosed 2019 Tax Receipt, prayerfully consider your offerings to Christ Church. Does it reflect your Christian faith? Are you doing your part for your beloved community of Christ Church? For those parishioners who have made a Stewardship Pledge for Fiscal 2020, please note pledge tracking is included. Ideally, as we are half way through the fiscal year, your commitment should be at 50%. Please accept our profound thanks for those who are keeping their pledge commitment current.
