Dear Friends:

As I write to you, I am on summer holidays with my wife Donethia, and our daughters Doren and Karis, visiting with family in the Bahamas. It seems to some to be an odd (...and perhaps, early) time to take vacation since we only just arrived at Christ Church Brampton on Sunday, June 15th! Yet, the timing itself - decided since late January - is just another one of those details caught up in this season of 'transition and new beginnings' in which I've found myself as my family and I moved from our former parish (St. Stephen, Downsview) to Christ Church Brampton.



Transition and new beginnings are not just a part of my story; they are a part of all our stories as we journey with Christ in faith. Friends, it is all a testament to the faithfulness of God in the interim - in periods of transition and new beginnings - to not let us fall.

Therefore, as we entrust ourselves to the hands of the living God - and as we look forward to the fall and to this next season of ministry together at Christ Church Brampton - I wish to highlight a few things. First, we are eagerly anticipating the arrival in September of our new Assistant Curate, the Rev. Dr. Michael Brain and his dear wife Bridget. Among other things Rev. Michael will be an important link between us and the wider community, work closely with our youth, and bolster our ministries in Christian education and pastoral care. We are also happily anticipating continued close collaboration with the Rev. Dr. Arthur Boers; also in support of our Christian education and pastoral care ministries.

Also beginning in September, I look forward to growing deeper in the faith with you through weekly opportunities for morning and evening prayer online, and through Bible study as we engage the gospel of Matthew.

Friends, this is an exciting and dynamic time in the life of Christ Church Brampton! I sincerely believe that in this season of transition and new beginnings, these opportunities for spiritual growth as a non-DNA family of faith are but the beginning of many new and exciting things to come. It is my hope and prayer that you will join us as we journey together into this new phase of ministry together!




Pastoral Care & Parish Visitors
