The carol, *In the Bleak Midwinter*, ends by asking a question of all of us who know the Christmas story, of how God gave himself to us in humble service: 'What can I give him, poor as I am? If I were a shepherd, I would bring a lamb; if I were a wise man, I would do my part'.

The carol provides the answer 'Yet, what can I give him? Give my heart'.

## Retirement Announced | 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Advent

Below a portion of the text from The Rev. Canon Byron Gilmore's retirement announcement that he made on the 1st Sunday of Advent (December 3, 2023)

Dear Friends – after much prayer and discernment it has become clear to me that the time for me to retire has come. So, I announce to you that I will retire at the end of April 2024 with my last Sunday with you being the second Sunday of Easter - April 7<sup>th</sup> – four months from now.

It has been an honour and a privilege to be your Pastor these past nearly 19 years.

I am deeply grateful for how you have supported me and my family in our years together among you. It has been such a joy and a privilege, and I speak for Kim, Spencer and Avery in adding their own thank-you to mine.

I am so thankful for the way my life and the life of my family were nurtured by our lives together with you. Christ Church was, and is, a great church to grow up in. Our sons enjoyed a fulsome Sunday School and youth program and grew up loved by you; Kim found deep fulfilment in working among the children, youth and families of our parish and I have found my deepest vocational joy among you.

At the end of the day, all I can say is: Thank you. Thank you. Thank you.

So, what are the "next steps" for Christ Church Brampton?

1. Formation of a Parish Selection Committee ("PSC")

On December 17, 2023, a Special Vestry was held to elect members of the Parish Selection Committee as required by Canon 10 of the Diocese of Toronto (*Clerical Appointments, Exchanges, Retirements and Terminations*). Shumaila Desrochers and John Joukema as Rector's Warden and Deputy People's Warden, respectively, are members of the PSC in accordance with Canon 10. Please note that paid employees (parish administrators, musicians, youth workers, etc.) and Honorary or Associate Clergy, including Deacons, cannot serve on a PSC.

2. <u>Meet with Area Bishop</u>

The selection process was presented at the Special Vestry. The process is fulsome for such an important task and will require our prayers and patience. The Parish Selection Committee is meeting with our Area Bishop, Kevin Robertson, on January 16, 2024, to gain a deeper understanding of the process and begin it in earnest.

Throughout the process, the PSC will keep you informed and there is most definitely an opportunity for your voice to be heard about the future of Christ Church and what we should be looking for in a new Incumbent.

3. Celebrate Byron | Sunday, April 7, 2024

Byron's last Sunday with us is April 7, 2024 (the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday after Easter). To celebrate Byron's retirement, please join us for a Potluck Lunch following the 10:00 service. More details to come but you won't want to miss this occasion to thank him and the Gilmore family for their ministry here at Christ Church and beyond.
