

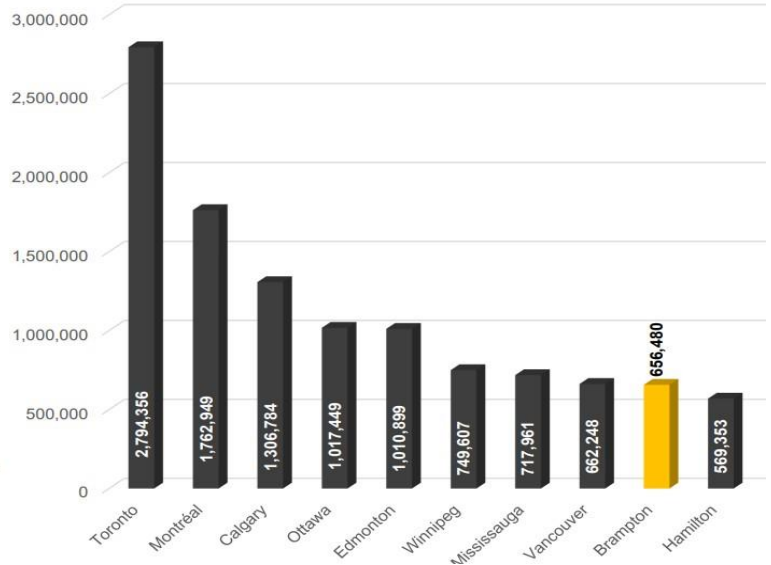

Population

Population 656,480 in 2021.

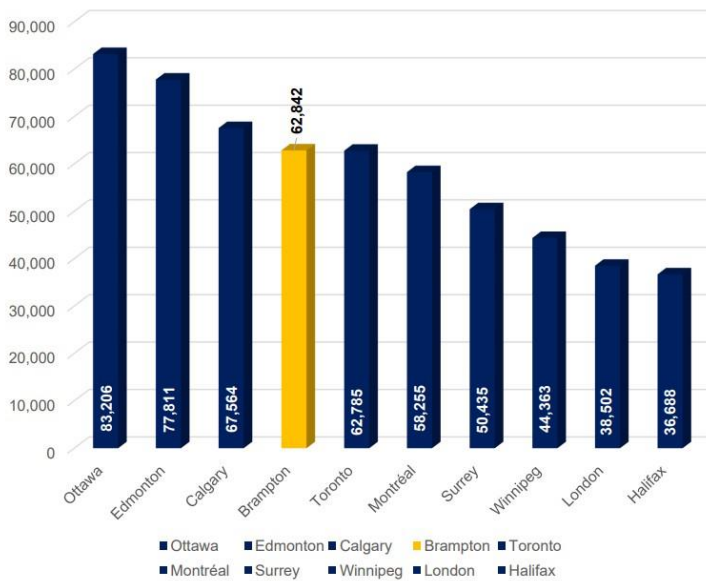
- An increase of 10.6% or 62,842 persons from the 2016 Census for an average annual growth rate of 2.12%. (Brampton's population was 234,445 in 1991).
 - Projected growth to 697,335 in 2024.
- 9th largest city in Canada,
4th largest in Ontario

Figure 2: Canada's 10 Fastest Growing Communities (by Net Increase 2016 - 2021)

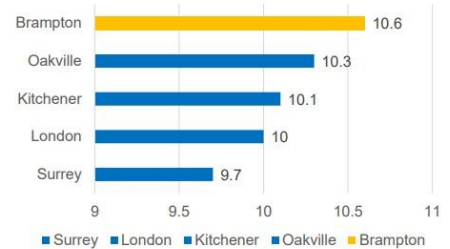

Brampton had the 4th Highest Population Growth in Canada based on total net increase in population.

With an average annual increase in population of 12,568.4 people over the 2016 – 2021 timeframe, Brampton recorded the fourth highest five-year net population increase among Canada's 10 fastest growing communities.

Top 5 Population Growth Rate % Within Canada's Largest Cities

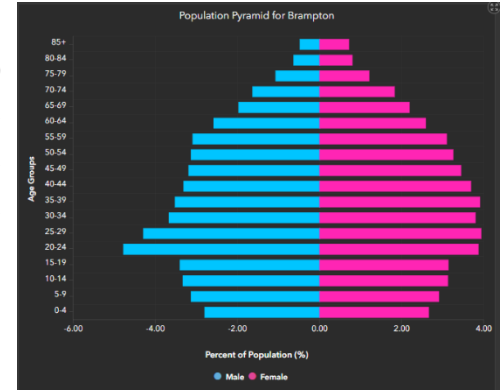


Brampton ranks 1st in terms of growth rate amongst Canada's 25 most populated cities.

- Brampton's population density was about 2,469 persons per square kilometre in 2021, up over 10% from 2,229 reported in the 2016 Census and ranked 2nd in Ontario behind Toronto.
- Median Income (2021): \$98,000 (after tax).
- Average age is 37.5 - lowest in Canada's 25 largest cities (Toronto's average age is 40.7). Brampton's population by age group per the 2021 census is as follows:

Children (0 – 14)	-	17.9%	(20.2% in 2016)
Youth (15 – 29)	-	23.4%	(21.2% in 2016)

Our focus on Children, Youth and Family ministry is supported by the demographics of our neighbourhood.

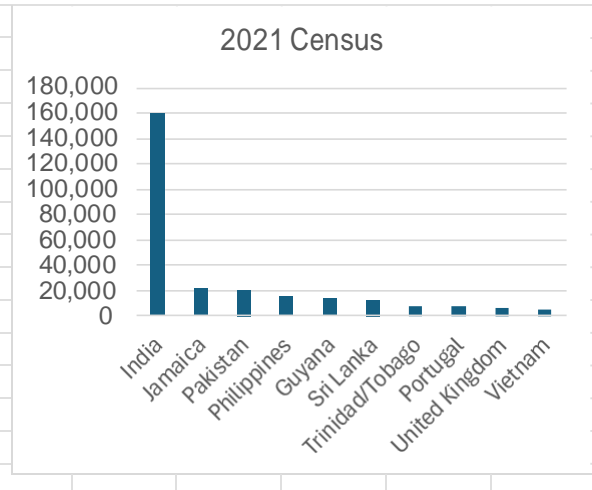


Immigration and Citizenship

The majority of Brampton residents are Canadian citizens. In 2021, 78.9% of Brampton residents (20.03% under 18 years old and 58.89% over 18) held Canadian citizenship compared to the national figure of 91.2% and provincial figure of 90.0%.

Between 2016 and 2021, a total of 50,095 immigrants arrived in Brampton. The top ten countries of birth during this period as shown in the table below. 80.6% (523,850) of Brampton's population are reported as visible minority in 2021, an increase of 20.9% (90,620) from 2016. India remains the most common place of birth for the immigrant population in the City of Brampton. 18% of Ontario's immigrant population lives in Peel.

Dwellings

There was a total of 189,086 private dwellings in Brampton in 2021, up 9% or 15,658 dwellings from the 2016 census. About 96,020 of Brampton's population live in a single-detached house, with the average number of 3.6 per private household.

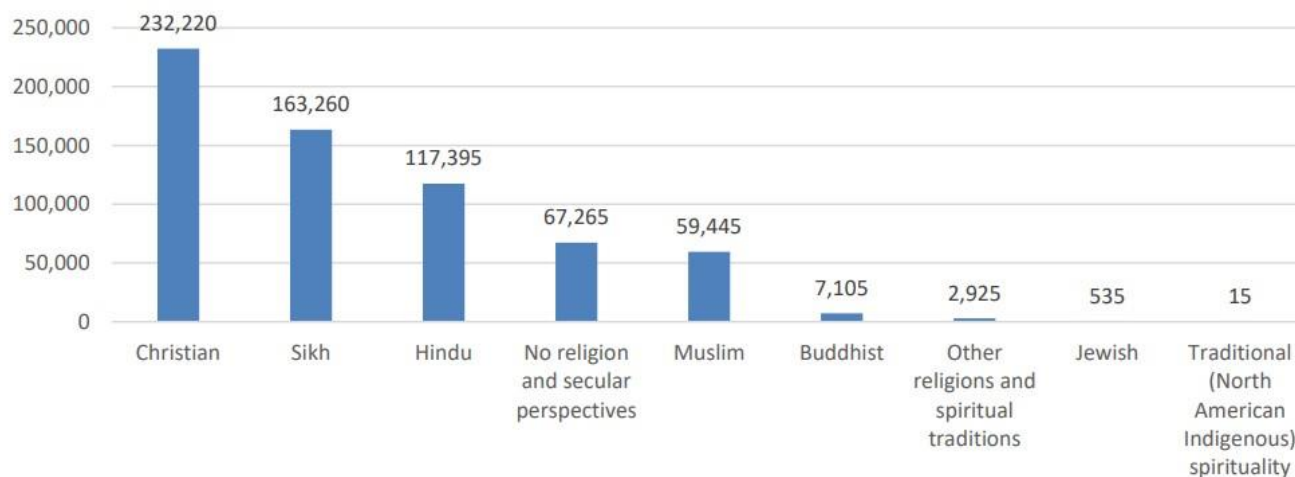
Religion (per 2011 HS)

Brampton is predominantly Christian with about 232,220 reporting as being Christian.

Roman Catholics are the largest single denomination in Brampton with 135,555 identified (at 26%, a decline from 34.9% in 2001), with Anglicans reporting 15,975 (3%, likely with a similar decline rate).

Christianity accounts for just over 50% with substantial growth in the Sikh and Hindu religion now accounting for 30% of the total population.

With a reduction in those reporting no religion between 2001 and 2011 (9.76% vs. 11.1%)
